

Casual Clothes Policy

The casual clothes policy following applies in all situations where students are allowed to wear casual clothes (non uniform) to school. This includes casual clothes days, swimming lesson days (Primary School), sport days and sport carnivals.

- » On school sport days or swimming carnivals, students should wear their Sport Uniform or Sport House coloured t-shirt. Costume garments should be appropriate and comply with Sunsmart guidelines.
- » Any casual clothes items should be clean and tidy, with no visible tears or stains.
- » Clothing should be modest and appropriate for school.
- » Slogans or writing on clothing or bags should not contradict the Christian ethos of our school.
- » Clothing should be weather appropriate.
- » Clothing should be sunsmart (ie. no tank tops, singlet tops or crop tops).
- » Shorts or skirts should be modest, with no underwear visible.
- » Tops should not be low-cut, midriff revealing, or transparent in any way.
- » Make up and jewellery (including nail polish) should be in compliance with the school's Uniform Guidelines. Clear gemstone or white pearl studs no larger than 0.5cm are permitted.
- » Hair may be worn down, but must be put up for safety/practical reasons during lessons which require it. (This is at the teacher's discretion, and not to be negotiated by students.) Hair must be up for Swimming Lessons and Sports Days.
- » Shoes should be sensible, closed in and low heel, and must allow for safety in classrooms and practical areas. Thongs, ugg boots and shoes with skates are not allowed, for safety reasons. Sandals are allowed only in Primary School.
- » School Uniform Hats should be worn as per Uniform Guidelines.
- » Students who do not comply with these guidelines, may have their parents contacted and be sent home to change and return to school with appropriate clothing. The student may be withdrawn from the scheduled activities.
- » Please remember to check with the Front Office for lost items.
